From the Director

Library Refinances Debt and Saves Taxpayers Over \$1.3 million

I am pleased to report that the library's debt refinancing was completed on September 22nd, resulting in a savings to our taxpayers of over 1.3 million dollars, including more than \$50,000 during this current budget year. These monies will be a great aid in offsetting the large cost increases recently approved by the NYS Retirement System, approved, by the way, after Board of Trustees adoption for our public budget vote. Thank you to my Board of Trustees for their support and continued dedication to sound fiscal operation.

Director Retires

After more than seventeen years as Executive Director of the HKDPL, effective December 31st I will be retiring to another state. During my tenure I have accomplished much, and I'd like to take this opportunity to offer thanks to my Board of Trustees, my skilled and loyal staff, and not least of all, to our patrons.

Seventeen years is a long time, and much has happened during that time. During my tenure we successfully passed a referendum to build our new 36,000 square foot building, and also renovate the historic Village Branch.

We were able to provide the newest technologies available: the automated RFID materials check-in and check-out system, teleconferencing, public internet, as well as hundreds of public programs enjoyed by patrons of all ages and backgrounds. Many of these innovations I'm proud to report have resulted in our ability to serve a growing patronage efficiently without increasing staff size.

We have been extremely active and successful in the application for and receipt of various types of grants, from both private and governmental sources: grants for construction, grants for technical equipment, grants for public programs, and, most recently, a \$244,000 two-year Public Computer Center grant to provide free computer and internet training at the Village Branch to help patrons find employment or advance in current jobs. This funding is being provided through the American Reinvestment and Recovery Act (ARRA) Broadband Technology Opportunities Program (BTOP).

Lastly, we have helped ensure the Library's future fiscal health via the bond refinancing referenced above.

The Board of Trustees has begun the task of searching for a new Director, and I am confident they will be successful, and will continue to make sound decisions for your Library.

Thank you again, it's been a great ride!

Would you like to take non-credit Continuing Education courses? They are online, and we have them. Choose from over 500, and finish each course at your own pace. Getting started is simple - from our website (www.hkdp.org) go to *Databases*, click on *Universal Class*, and register.

Photoshop, **Illustrator**, **Flash**, **InDesign**, **Dreamweaver** and **Acrobat Professional**. Adobe uses interactive design tools enabling you to create 3-D artwork, models and logos, and produce eye-catching graphics, edit images, and build great websites. If you want to create a newsletter with high quality interactive capabilities, **InDesign** is the software for you. If you want to build a website (without writing code) featuring stunning interactive banners with great effects and images you can easily manipulate, then try using **Dreamweaver**, **Flash** and **Photoshop Extended**. Adobe CS (Creative Suite) 3, 4 & 5 are available on the mid-Level computer center. CS5 is also available on two MAC computers, also on the mid-level.

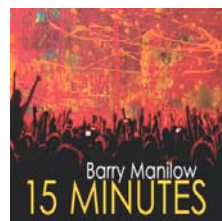
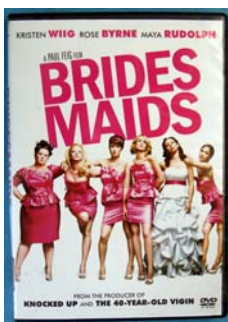

Coming in December - Symphony

The computer catalog and circulation system used by our Library is scheduled to be replaced in December. HKDPL participates in a shared computer system used by 46 member libraries in the Ramapo Catskill Library System. Since 2005, the Library has used the Horizon library software, which is no longer being supported. After extensive research into other software options, the libraries have opted to migrate to the **Symphony** software system.

From December 5 to December 8, 2011, the Library catalog will not display accurate circulation data, nor will it allow hold requests to be placed. During those days all current checkouts, fine blocks, and existing hold requests will be transferred to the new system.

The new library catalog will have a different look and feel, and will offer additional searching capabilities. Two of the great new features available in the system are the ability to pay fines from home using your PayPal account, and the ability to select the location from which you want to pick up your items. Also, a mobile app will be available for your smartphone. Please note that any lists you may have saved using the "MY DISCOVERIES" feature on our library catalog will not be moved to the new system. You'll need to print or save this information elsewhere by doing a Copy/Print command on your computer.

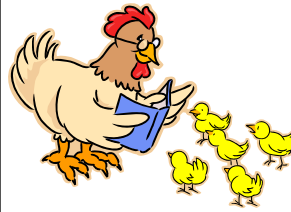

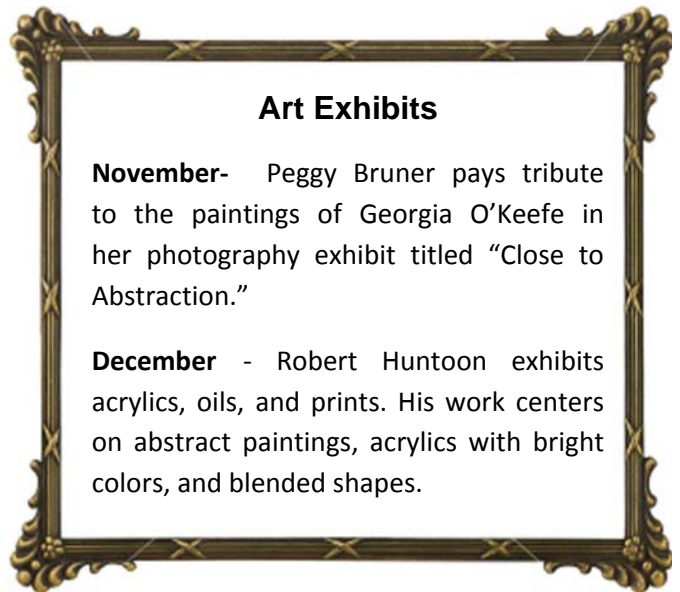
